- The objective of the program is to remove obstructions and debris in the waterways that could slow down natural drainage in small streams and rivers throughout Cook County.

#### **Small Streams Maintenance Program**


- Average cost per cubic yard of debris removed of \$146.
- Goals: standardizing procedures, identifying critical stream areas, improving methods, scheduling critical inspections, and increasing the public's awareness of MWRD's presence and execution of the program.


Debris amounts removed in each watershed for 2024

- Don't litter! Properly dispose of trash,
- If you live on a stream, consider landscaping with native plants and removing invasive plants such as buckthorn. Many native plants have a strong root structure that resists erosion.

#### Small Streams Maintenance Program (SSMP)

The stream that flows through your neighborhood is more that just a scaric part of the landscape or habitat for wildlife. It serves the vital function of dearing stormwater and preventing flooding, in order to function of

The MWRD's SSMP works to kisep our streams functioning by removing delaris that can restrict their flow. Minor blockages can build up quickly as floating debris piles up and preates a dam. In our flat landscape, obstructions in one spot can contribute to flooding upstream.


Basides removing existing obstructions, the MWID crews and engineers also work to identify and fix potential problems before they can cause flooding. Dead and dying trees, which can eventually fall into streams and can floor down and cause damage to bridge colverts or cause a log part, are removed from the banks.

#### Small stream maintenance

The MWRD's Small Stream Maintenance Program (SSMP) removes obstructions and debris that could slow natural drainage in small streams and rivers throughout Cook County. Blockages in rivers and streams can cause standing or slow water upstream and contribute to flooding. The Small Stream Maintenance Program also removes invasive plants, downed trees, low hanging branches, dense weeds, and addresses eroding stream banks. We remove thousands of yards of debris from local streams each year.


- Free native tree saplings through our "Restore the Canopy, Plant a Tree" program.
