ANTI-ASIAN HATE AND VIOLENCE

1885: Rock Springs Massacre Anti-Chinese hate drives 150 white miners in Rock Springs. WY to brutally attack their Chinese coworkers, killing 28, wounding 15, and driving several

hundred more out of town. 1942: Japanese American Internment

Following Executive Order 9066, over 120,000 people of Japanese ancestry

(nearly two-thirds U.S. citizens) were forced to leave their homes and

confined in internment camps for years. 1982: Murder of Vincent Chin

Massive lavoffs in the U.S. auto industry

drive anti-Japanese sentiment. Vincent Chin, a Chinese American, was murdered in Detroit. Two white autoworkers convicted without jail time.

2022: Atlanta Spa Mass Shooting Amid a rise in Anti-Asian hate during the COVID-19 pandemic, 8 people, 6 of

whom were Asian women, were killed.
