CIVIL RIGHTS

1960s-70s: Asian American Movement Birth of an activist movement that embraces pan-Asianism and solidarity with marginalized communities.

1988: Civil Liberties Act

The U.S. formally apologizes for Japanese American internment during WWII and orders \$20,000 redress

payments to all living survivors.

1990s: Asian American Studies

In 1995, Northwestern University students go on a 23-day hunger strike for Asian American studies. Programs established at Northwestern University in 1999 and University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2012,

2011: Asian American Voting Rights
The Illinois Voting Rights Act recognizes
Asian American Voting Rights for the
first time. The new map includes the

state's first four Asian American
Influence Districts, each with over 15
percent Asian American populations.
