ASIAN AMERICAN LABOR MOVEMENT

1867: The Central Pacific Strike Over 2,000 Chinese workers strike for a week demanding better working conditions and equal pay.

Early 1900s: Hawaii Plantation Strikes Strikes by Japanese and Filipino workers for better wages and housing.

1965-1970: Delano, CA Grape Strike Filipino farm workers (Agricultural Workers Organizing Committee) strike over poor pay and working conditions. Supported by Cesar Chavez (National Farm Workers Association) this is the first of many acts of solidarity.

1982: NY Garment Workers Strike Over 20,000 mostly Chinese women garment workers rally and win strike in New York's Chinatown.

1995: El Monte, CA Garment Workers 72 Thai nationals held as forced labor becomes one of the first modem-day slavery case in the U.S.
