Ms. Johnson began the meeting at 10:01 a.m. Ms. Johnson read the names of attendees for roll call and asked others to register their attendance in the chat box. Mr. Roat discussed time lapse graphics showing stormwater projects awarded since 2011. He noted that the MWRD is currently engaged in 31 stormwater projects in the North Branch area. He provided an overview of the 2020 green infrastructure call for projects and those that were selected for funding.

Mr. Roat reviewed several ongoing green infrastructure projects in Evanston, Kenilworth, Skokie, Niles, and Winnetka. He highlighted a cross section of what green alley projects utilize to handle stormwater runoff. He also provided an update on the suburban Space to Grow initiative, which is still in the planning stages with schools being evaluated for eligibility in the program. He noted that selected schools would be presented to the Board of Commissioners in 2021 with construction of the pilot program projects scheduled for 2022. \

Mr. Roat introduced a video presentation on green alleys in Harwood Heights. Ms. Saulsberry asked whether MWRD would have jurisdiction in the Cahokia Heights area, and Mr. Roat responded that MWRD only has legislative regulatory authority to enter into stormwater management projects in Cook County. Ms. Saulsberry asked if staff knew what the percentage of water reduction was with green alleys, and Mr. Roat responded that he did not know specifics, but that percentages vary depending on the project and the stormwater events that they are designed for. Mr. Fisher noted that the green infrastructure projects generally do not reduce runoff to the same degree that traditional grey infrastructure does, but if placed strategically can have effective results in reducing five year events. He noted that green infrastructure projects have the added benefit of improving water quality through natural filtration. Ms. Saulsberry asked if MWRD engages in projects involving cool pavement, and Mr. Fisher noted that the District does not have experience with those projects as they are more focused on volume capture. He noted that MWRD's program to distribute oak saplings could have the co-benefit of reducing heat islands, but their main focus is on stormwater benefits.

Mr. Podgorny discussed the Small Streams Maintenance program which removes debris from waterways to allow stormwater to flow downstream. He provided on overview of the equipment that is used to clear debris and the importance of working with the local officials in reporting blockages and having them addressed. Mr. Podgorny noted several different ways that people can report blockages, including the MWRD's website and mobile app. He

discussed MWRD's rain barrel program and the Restore the Canopy program, which provides tree saplings for large projects as well as individuals.

Ms. Johnson thanked attendees for participating in the video conference. Ms. Saulsberry asked when a recording of the meeting would be posted, and Ms. Wright responded that a recording would likely not be available but she would send the slides to attendees who were interested. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:32 a.m.
